PREREQUISITE: Intermediate Algebra Math 114 with a grade of C or better or placement exam.
Advisory: English Writing 100 and Reading 100 (or Language Arts 100) or ESL equivalent courses.

TEXTBOOK: Collaborative Statistics, by Illowsky and Dean

CALCULATOR: I will be using a TI 84 Plus graphing calculator(similar to the TI 82/83) . If you use any other graphing calculators it will be your responsibility to know how to use it. Please make sure you label your calculator with your name and phone number, in case you loose it.

ATTENDANCE: Except for emergencies or sickness, I expect you to attend every class. However if you do miss a class, it is your responsibility to ask another student about the material covered, homework assigned and whether a test date was announced. Please exchange phone number or email with at least one person in the class to cover this eventuality.
I may drop a student from the class if they are absent for five or more classes, or miss a major test without notifying me in advance. I may also drop a student if, in my judgment, they disrupt the learning environment of the class.

COURSE GRADE: The weight of your assignments, quizzes, tests and final on your overall course grade is as follows:

You assignment score will be calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Total points earned on your assignments}}{\text{Total points possible on the assignments}} \times 10$$

Your midterm tests score will be calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Total points earned on your tests}}{\text{Total points possible on the tests}} \times 30$$

Your quizzes, labs and final exam score will be calculated similarly.

All students must attain at least 50 % on the final exam to pass the class with at least a C.

HOMEWORK

Homework will be assigned at the completion of each chapters and the due date will be announced in class. Late homework will not be accepted. I will be grading a subset of the problems assigned and this will constitute you assignment grade. Your two lowest homework grades will be dropped. **Assignments must be handed in at the beginning of class.**

QUIZZES

Quizzes will test your understanding of the homework problems. You will need to do the homework thoroughly and completely to do well on the quizzes. **There will be no makeup for missed quizzes**, so if you miss a quiz, you get a score of zero on it. Your two lowest quiz grades will be dropped when I calculate your overall quiz grade.

TESTS

There will be three one hour tests, one around the fourth week of the session, the second around the seventh week and the last in the last week of class. **There will be no makeup for these tests.**

LABS

Lab assignments make use of the calculator. Even though we will start the labs in class, you will likely not be able to complete them in class. There is no make-up for labs. **No late labs will be accepted and no labs will be dropped.**
